Concluding Remarks from the Outgoing COAA President (2013)

Dear COAA Members,

The 2014 COAA AMS banquet concluded my term as the president of COAA. I'd like to take this opportunity to express my sincere gratitude to all COAA members, especially the board and our sponsors (Hong Kong Jockey Club, US National Science Foundation, the Chinese University of Hong Kong, Beijing Normal University, Sun Yat-sen University, ERT Inc., IMSG, and individual donors). All together, we raised ~ \$150,000 to sponsor a record-breaking number of activities this year. Your supports and participation are most gratefully appreciated.

In the past year, COAA convened many events. In spring, COAA organized a workshop and a forum on China's environment and climate, invited outstanding speakers including Dr. Fuzhong Weng of NOAA, Profs Ming Cai of FSU, Xinzhong Liang of UMD, Tong Zhu of PKU, Renyi Zhang of TAMU, Zhanqing Li of UMD, and Dr. Chungu Lu of NSF. The 6th International Conference on Atmosphere, Ocean and Climate Change was held in Hongkong on 19-21 August 2013. Nearly 200 scholars including 50 invited speakers from around the world attended this conference.

With respect to public outreach, COAA reception at the AGU fall meeting (co-convened with PKU Alumni association) attracted 180 attendees including special guests like Prof. Kuo-Nan Liou of UCLA, a recipient of the AGU's Roger Revelle Award and all Chinese AGU award recipients and new fellows, as well as 5 past and current presidents of the AGU and AGU's atmospheric section heads. COAA reception at the AMS meeting had more than 120 attendees. The Chinese AMS awardees, new AMS fellows and honorary fellow (Prof. Qingcun Zeng) joined this reception. The annual fall picnic in Rockville, MD reunited many local COAA members and their families.

In the past month, COAA's Chinese new-year gala was held in UMD. Two newly elected honorary members, Prof. Yihui Ding of CMA and Dr. William Lau of NASA, gave outstanding lectures that draw considerable attention from the audience. After the ceremony, the new president, Dr. Chung-Chu Teng, introduced the new board members.

Last year, COAA bestowed the first outstanding PhD thesis awards (first, second and third prizes). This year, COAA signed an agreement with the Springer publisher to automatically honor the first prize recipient as the joint COAA-Springer excellent dissertation awardee. The Springer will publish the awardee's thesis free of charge and the author will receive a prize of 500 Euro. The 2nd and 3rd places were awarded by COAA of \$300 and \$200 respectively with certificates. This award was established to encourage new Chinese PhD graduates to pursue their academic careers.

Having reported 9 events taking place in the last year, I'd stop counting more, for "9" means longevity in Chinese, and I hope for COAA to live and be active for ever for the sake of commonwealth and well-being of all members, especially the younger generations.

On February 4, 2014, COAA held a banquet during the American Meteorological Society (AMS) Annual Meeting at the Centergy Building of Georgia Institute of Technology at Atlanta, GA. More than 120 participants from around the world attended the banquet. The reception started with a delicious Chinese buffet and fresh pizzas. The outgoing COAA President (2013), Prof. Zhanqing Li, chaired the Reception. He first reported the COAA activities and accomplishments in 2013. The incoming COAA President (2014), Dr. Chung-Chu Tung, introduced the new COAA board members and briefly described what COAA plans to do in 2014.

Among many honorable guests, the newly elected AMS honorary member, Prof. Qingcun Zeng (Institute of Atmospheric Physics, CAS) gave a humble speech about his gratitude to the society and his confidence about the bright future of young Chinese scholars. 
COAA Chinese Doctorate Thesis Award in 2013

COAA founded this award to support the research of tomorrow's leading Chinese scientists. This year, COAA signed an agreement with Springer to establish the "COAA-Springer Excellent Thesis Award". The winner will receive €500 sponsored by Springer, and the thesis will be published by Springer as well.

This year, four winners were selected by the COAA Review Panel from many applicants who received their Ph.D. degrees in the period of 30 Sept 2013 – 1 Oct 2014 in the United States. On February 4, 2014, the winners of COAA Chinese Doctorate Thesis Award 2013 were announced and awarded at COAA's Banquet at 2014 AMS meeting.

The "COAA-Springer Excellent Thesis Award" was given to Dr. Yuan Wang, who worked with Prof. Renyi Zhang at TAMU, and published 10 papers during his Ph.D. study. This year's winners are:

- 1st Award, €500, thesis published by Springer: Yuan Wang, PhD, TAMU (supervisor, Prof. Renyi Zhang)
- 2nd Award, \$300: Sanmei Li, PhD, George Mason U (supervisor, Prof. Donglian Sun)
- 3rd Award, \$200: Tianyu Jiang, PhD, Georgia Tech (supervisor: Prof. Yi Deng) and Lei Huang, PhD, Texas Austin (supervisor: Prof. Rong Fu)




Dr. Yuan Wang received the best thesis award (from left to right: Z. Li, R. Zhang, Y. Wang, and Springer representative Ron Doering)

COAA 2014 Honorary Member Lecture

COAA 2014 Honorary Member Lecture was held on January 25, 2014 at the Univ. of Maryland, College Park, MD. COAA elected two new honorary members: Academician Yihui Ding of the China's National Climate Center, and Dr. William Lau of the NASA/GSFC. Professor Ding gave a talk entitled "Global Climate Change and the Inter-decadal Variability of the East Asian Winter Monsoon"; while Dr. Lau presented "The Yin-Yan (floods and droughts) and the Chi (Hadley Circulation) of the Global Water Cycle". Using various datasets as well as their seasonal forecast model, Prof. Ding described the anomalous weather pattern in China in the last winter, and its association to decadal oscillations. Dr. Lau started his introduction of extreme weather event with Taoism's concepts of Yin-Yan (阴阳) and Chi (气). He then presented the future pattern of expanded Hadley cell circulation and its impact on the extreme weather.

Both lectures were very informative and inspiring, and draw considerable attention from the audience. There were also interactive discussions and exchanges of ideas between the audience and the lecturers. Prof. Ding and Dr. Lau received "COAA Honorary Member" plaques as recognition to their individual scientific achievements. This lecture has successfully facilitated professional interaction among established and young scientists in the COAA community. A Chinese New Year gala was followed afterwards.



Spotlight of the COAA Stars

Many Chinese scholars won international recognitions of their contributions to oceanic and atmospheric sciences. In this COAA newsletter, we spotlight Prof. Kuo-Nan Liou of UCLA, who won the prestigious Roger Revelle Medal of AGU, and Prof. Qingcun Zeng of Chinese Academy of Science, who was elected as the AMS honorary fellow. Both are also COAA's honorary members for many years.

Prof. Kuo-Nan Liou (UCLA) *AGU Roger Revelle Medalist, 2013*

The Revelle Medal is awarded for “outstanding contributions in atmospheric sciences, atmosphere- ocean coupling, atmosphere-land coupling, biogeochemical cycles, climate, or related aspects of the Earth system.” The citation reads: “Dr. Kuo-Nan Liou’s accomplishments in research and leadership service are the perfect embodiment of this ideal. He made trail blazing contributions in radiation, the prime driver in the Earth’s energy budget, and in cloud physics; both are fundamental to our understanding of climate dynamics and atmosphere- surface interactions. Moreover, his leadership successively as chair of two departments and as director of two separate Institutes and his outreach initiatives in spearheading hydrologic-atmospheric experimentation and in founding the Joint Institute for Regional Earth System Science and Engineering (JIFRESSE) at UCLA reveal him to be a true leader in the image of Roger Revelle”.

Prof. Liou did his B.S. in Taiwan Univ., and Ph.D. in NYU. He was a faculty of Univ. of Washington, Univ. of Utah, and now he is a distinguished professor of UCLA and director of JIFRESSE. Dr. Liou was elected to the US National Academy of Engineering in 1999 and Academia Sinica of Taiwan in 2004. Prof. Liou had advised 30 Ph.D. students, wrote three popular books, and received numerous awards to acknowledge his contributions (e.g., the AMS Charney Award in 1998, COSPAR Biennial William Nordberg Medal in 2010, International Radiation Commission’s Gold Medal in 2012). He is a fellow of AGU, AMS and AAAS.

In his response to the Revelle medal, he said: “I would like to thank Wilfried Brutsaert for his generous remarks and unwavering support and encouragement in my pursuit of academic and research excellence and to extend my appreciation to the Revelle Medal Selection Committee for recognizing my contributions to radiative transfer and related climate and remote sensing fields... Over the last 30 years, I have had the privilege of working with a number of bright and talented graduate students at the University of Utah and UCLA who complemented my strengths in research. They deserve to share, in equal measure, any recognition I have received, including this great honor from AGU. It is in this spirit that I accept the Roger Revelle Medal.”

Spotlight of the COAA Stars

Prof. Qingcun Zeng (IAP/CAS)
newly elected AMS honorary fellow 2014

AMS honorary members acknowledge persons “preeminence in the atmospheric or related oceanic or hydrologic sciences, either through their own contributions to the sciences or their application or through furtherance of the advance of those sciences in some other way.” This year, Prof. Qingcun Zeng from IAP/CAS joined Prof. Robert Dickinson (UT Austin) and Sir Brian Hoskins (Univ. Reading) in receiving this prestigious honor.

Prof. Zeng did his B.S. in the Dept. of Physics of Peking University in 1956, and a doctoral degree in USSR Academy of Science in 1961. He is a member and the Vice-president of the International Euro-Asian Academy of Sciences, and served as the president and honorary president of the China Meteorological Society, vice-president of the China Association of Science and Technology, director of the Institute of Atmospheric Physics, member of the National Academy of Sciences of China, etc. He received numerous scientific awards such as the Award of National Natural Sciences, National Pioneer Scientist, Outstanding Science and Technology Achievement Prize.

Several major meteorological disasters occurred in China causing tremendous damage in 1950s led Prof. Zeng to choose atmospheric physics and numerical weather forecast as his major. After obtaining a doctor degree from Soviet Union, Prof. Zeng went back China and built up China’s first generation air-sea general circulation model and land surface processes model. “He opened up a new discipline-computational geophysical fluid dynamics, established systematic theories of atmospheric evolution processes and wave ensemble dynamics, and introduced natural cybernetics.”

Prof. Zeng wrote two books that served as the standard textbooks for Chinese college students in this area (Principle of Atmospheric Infrared Remote Sensing, Mathematical and Physical Basis of Numerical Weather Prediction). He had trained a dozen of excellent Ph.D. students, many of whom are active involved in the advances of atmospheric science in China and in the United States.
